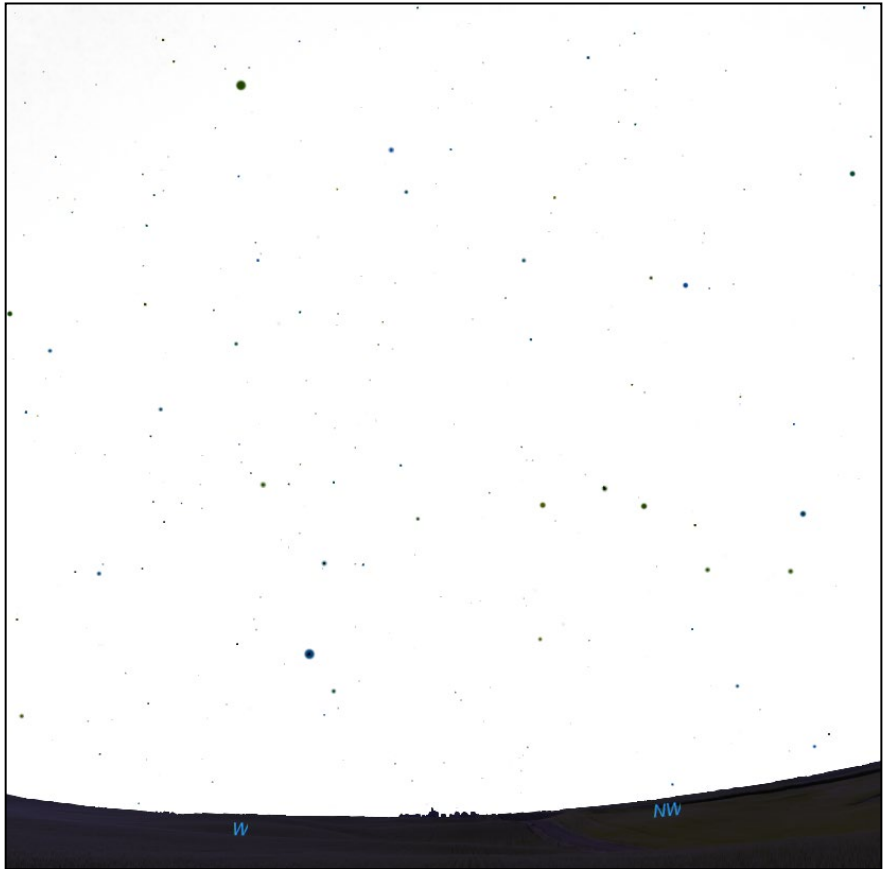

Note legends about the constellations & stars, also write about interesting objects found in these constellations (nebulae, galaxies, etc. ... at least 2 in each). Exploring the legends and deep sky objects is how the sky become your friend!¹²
