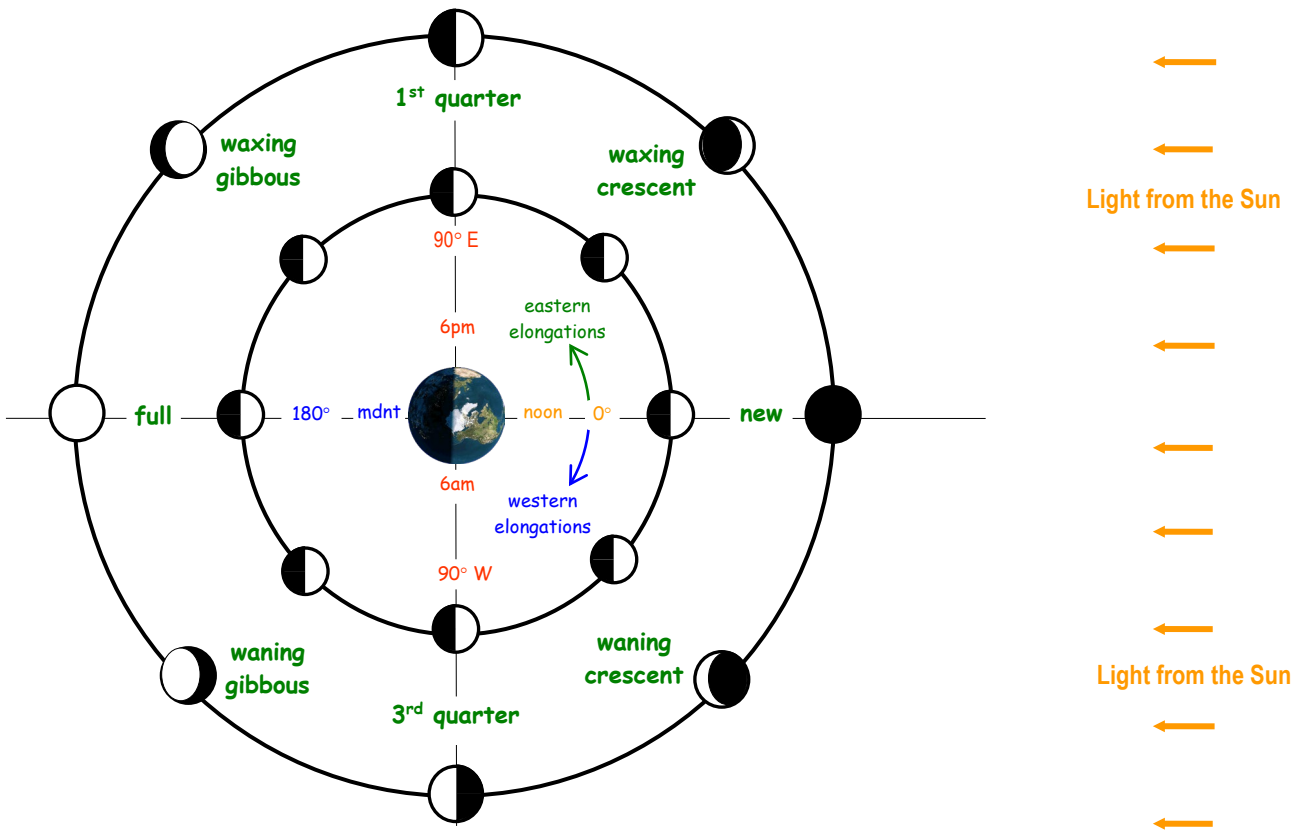


PHASES OF THE MOON

The inner circle shows the moon in its orbit, the outer circle shows how each phase appears as seen from Earth

*The "transit time" is the time when the object crosses the observer's meridian
