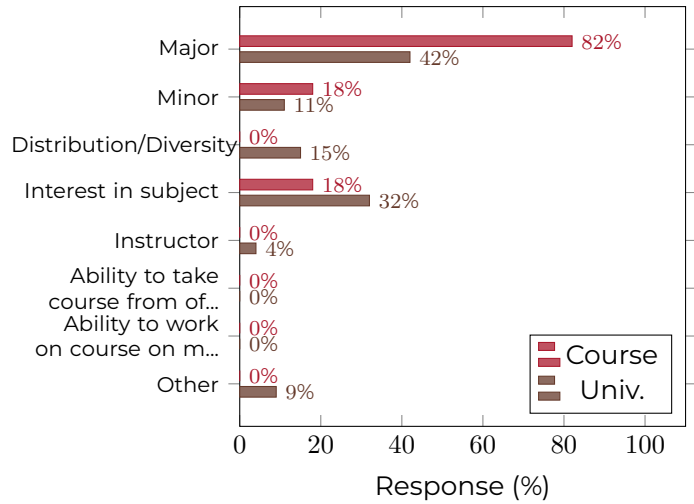

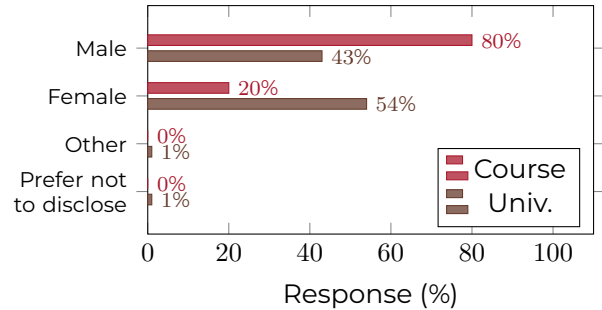

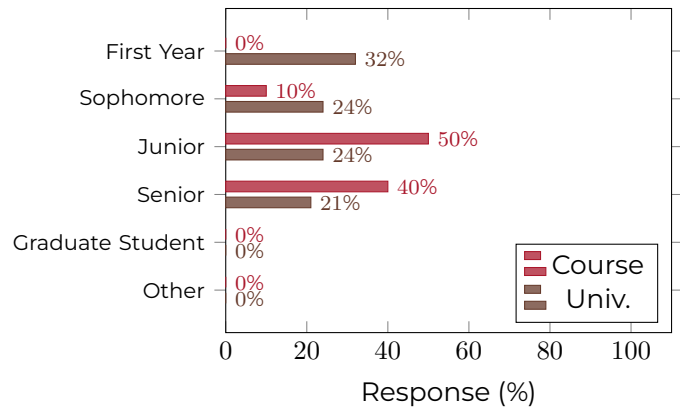

Class Year

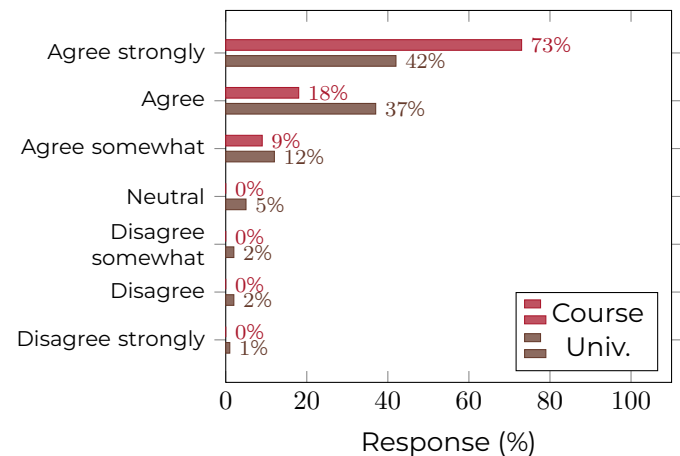

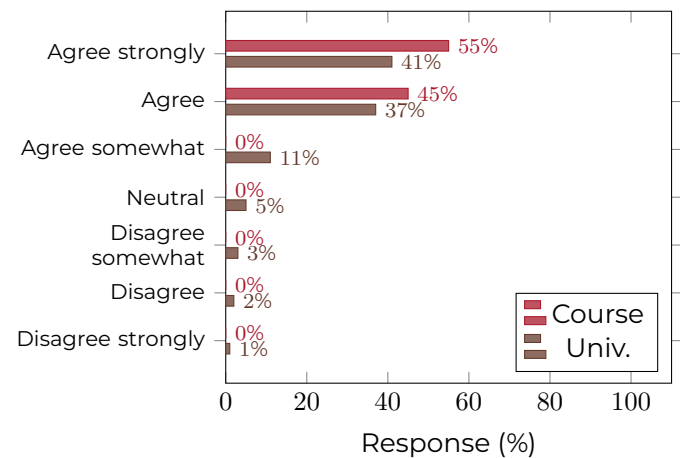

Comments
- Learning the basics of web development is a useful skill as the market becomes even more popular
I enjoyed this class because it's a great and interesting course. Some topics are still confusing to me because I never got to "catch up" when falling behind in class. I still learned a great deal when I didn't fall behind in class.
* I feel so disgustingly confident in my web dev skills/JS abilities after this course. The opportunities to learn experientially through group work and projects (and exams somehow) make me feel like I just KNOW my stuff. Mastery of material, not just to crush exams + projects but to use JS etc. beyond this course
I've been briefly exposed to HTML in the past, however CSS, JS, and how the internet works are concepts I was ignorant on before. I got a lot out of this class.
This course has helped my learning by teaching me about web development, a skill I will likely need in my coding future.
I now have the skills to create my own web application.

- Course units were communicated clearly both in-person & virtually - Most aspects in the field were introduced evenly.

Each day is a new lecture and a new topic or a topic relating to the previous lecture. I only wished we had some more notes to take as we were coding/querying since coding was too fast to really take a moment to jot it down before falling behind.
* I knew where to find stuff, knew what to do.
I think the order of learning topics was effective. Starting w/ HTML & CSS basics and moving on to the more complex concepts is an effective ordering of topics.
Everything we needed to know about upcoming classes, projects and exams was on Sakai and would be constantly updated
Sometimes I felt that we were covering too many topics at the same time. The order that we covered topics was perfect.
Splitting up the class by front-end vs back-end was good.
Lectures are great; notes are organized and clear
Love the way Kevin organizes classes with exams and projects. This was no different. Also very organized website with all our work and what we did in class in one place—better than Sakai

Kevin is a great professor and enables us to ask questions during class and is available for questions outside of class.
* Kevin is really good at encouraging questions + course understanding through his demeanor and his beginning of class period summaries.
By virtue of being a higher level elective, everyone there wanted to be. Kevin was the same. We were all engaged and interested and Kevin is passionate, an effective teacher, and fun.
Kevin would ask frequent questions and would also stop the class frequently to check bugs and/or errors in peoples code and fix them

The instructor is extremely friendly and we love participating in his class

- Focusing on multiple projects throughout the semester. - Preparing for time-consuming assignments
Instructor had very appropriate expectations for the course.
I believe it is on par with my expectation of a 300-level course, but it was still quite difficult to juggle with other courses. Kevin balanced everything quite well.
At times this course was "too challenging", but in quotes because without that I don't think I would have learned the material as well as I had. None of the work was "busy work", it always felt like it enhanced my learning.
Particularly as it came to the projects, there was a lot of work to be done. This led to no small degree of struggling. However, I was always pleasantly surprised by my grades. Kevin's more relaxed grading matches the workload well.
The workload was fair, with readings due every class and projects having three weeks until they were due. Kevin also wasn't too harsh or too lenient of a grader.
We were always held to a high standard when submitting work.
The projects are very stressful because they are so large.
We need to understand the materials and put in the work on projects
Lots of work when projects were out, but balanced out by not a lot crazy amount of work during regular times

- All feedback was detailed
Was very patient and helpful
Kevin explained topics thoroughly during student hours and assisted me with understanding the material better.
It did, I don't know. I learned my mistakes after exams + projects.
Some feedback on projects was a little sparse, but otherwise great.
Kevin would typically return code with a grade around a week after it was submitted with fair criticism and other ways the code could have been done.
The feedback was always fair and detailed.
Very timely assessments.
Great feedback on the online forum (piazza); he is always available to answer questions and eager to help
Got valuable feedback on assignments (projects, exams), quick grading.

His very chronological way of teaching topics made sure you had everything you needed Before moving on to the next topic.
